Dr. Stephen E. Brock is the current Past-President of the National Association of School Psychologists, as well as a Professor, and the School Psychology Program Coordinator in the College of Education at California State University, Sacramento (CSUS).

Dr. Brock is the lead editor of the NASP publication *Best Practices in School Crisis Prevention and Intervention* (2nd ed.) and the lead author of *School Crisis Prevention and Intervention: The PREPaRE Model.*

Dr. Brock worked for 18 years as a school psychologist with the Lodi, CA Unified School District, including 6 years as the lead psychologist. He helped develop the district school crisis response protocol and specialized in functional behavioral assessment.

Dr. Brock's academic work has included study of school-based crisis intervention; systems-level school crisis response; suicide prevention, intervention, and postvention; violence prevention; and threat assessment. He has over 250 publications (including 11 book titles) and over 200 invited or referred state, national, and international conference presentations.
